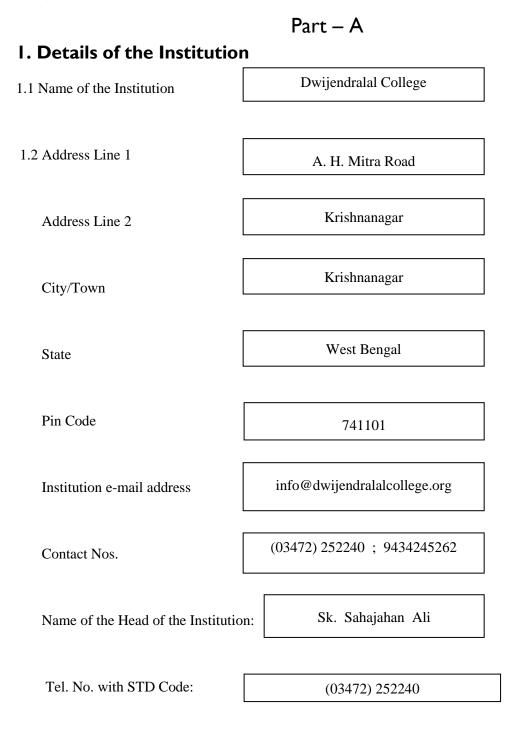

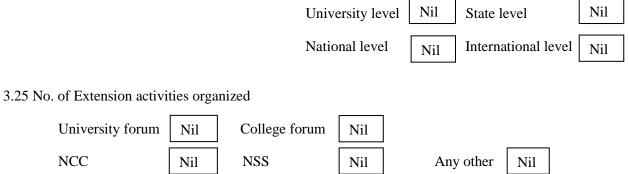

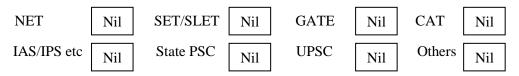

8. Plans of institution for next year

- 1. Installation of CCTV in the college campus, to keep a close eye on what is going on there in the real time
- 2. Construction of some more classrooms to provide enhanced accommodation for the students.
- 3. Three phase electricity connection and installation of 15kVA sound proof generator .

Annexure III

Best Practice No. 1

1. Title of the Practice : Half - free Studentship

2. Goal : The objective of this practice is to financially support meritorious students from economically backward families who attend classes regularly.

3. The context : At present there are many scholarships given to college - students by the government, such as scholarships for SC/ST, minorities, wards of beedi workers, etc. A college has also some social responsibility to provide financial support to students. Our college has been striving to fulfil this responsibility, to some extent, through the provision of half-free studentship.

4. The Practice : The system of half - free studentship provides financial support to meritorious students from economically backward families who attend classes regularly, by waiving half of the tuition fees to be paid by them. The students of all classes applying for half - free studentship are judged on the basis of three criteria : (a) marks obtained in the last examination, (b) family income, and (c) percentage of attendance in classes. Each of the criterion is assigned a maximum weightage of 10 points. The students are ranked based on the points obtained out of a total of 30 points. The percentage of students in a particular class eligible for securing half-free studentship is 10% of the total number of students in that class. The lists of eligible students of the various classes are prepared and necessary action is taken by the college authority.

5. Evidence of success : 432 students have received half - free studentship during the academic years 2009-10 and 2010-11.

6. Problems encountered and Resources Required : There is still some lack of enthusiasm on part of the students in applying for half - free studentship . Though the scheme has been quite successful , the number of applicants (i.e. 432) is less than that of the number of eligible students (i.e. 444) during the academic years 2009-10 and 2010-11.

Best Practice No. 2

1. Title of the Practice: Sustainable Development.

2. Goal: The goal of this practice is

- To develop the physical infrastructure of the college.
- To ensure a better use of the available space in the campus for the teaching-learning purpose.
- To provide enhanced classrooms, library and other facilities to the students.

With a view to these missions, we have undertaken the development plan, through which the college will be able to cope up with its different infrastructural needs of the present time and of the near future.

3. The context: The College was a single department college only after a few years ago; it was a commerce college. The process of diversification started from the year 2003, and it is still under expansion. Different various subjects and disciplines are being added in almost every year. So the number of classes as well as the number of students is gradually increasing. To cope up with this extended demand of classrooms and other infrastructure, we have undertaken the practice of sustainable development, having a view unto the future.

4. **The Practice:** It was the base plan to reconstruct the buildings which are very old. In addition to that, plan for constructing new buildings are also undertaken. A number of new structures are made within this year. A classroom and a seminar hall are constructed. The college library is reconstructed with a larger space, and the initiation is taken for construct a hostel for the female students of the college who come from a distant place.

5. Evidence of success: As it is a long term plan and the implementation of the plan consumes a good time, it is hard to expect a quick success over a year, but students are benefited with this practice. The enhanced number of classrooms provided more accommodation for students. The enhanced library is now able to stack more books and serve more students. The seminar hall claims to be mentioned specially. It serves not only the students of the college but the local society as a hole. Various social activities of the neighbouring society are observed in our seminar hall, on a regular basis.

6. Problems encountered and Resources Required: The first and foremost problem in this plan and practice is the lack of space in the college campus. Due to lack of space, the construction activity has caused a little disturbance to the classes. And it restricted the scope of expansion to a certain limit, too. We were not able to expand the library as much as it will need in the coming days due to this constraint.

This experience leads us to think that in the near future to may need to have a second campus in order to attain our expansion plans.
