Best Practice No. 1

1. Title of the Practice: Online Admission.

- **2**. **Goal:** The goal of this practice is
 - To provide ease of access to the potential students to the admission procedure.
 - To ensure transparency in the admission procedure.
 - To reduce the rush and long queue for admission forms, which is often very troublesome for the potential students, and tricky to manage form the part of the college authority, too.
 - To cope up with the modern era of information technology.

With a view to these aims, we have constructed three new classrooms in the second floor of the commerce building of the college. .

- 3. The context: There is a steady demand for the admission form of this college to the potential students. So long queues were a common scenario during the time of admission. It was troublesome, time consuming and hazardous, for both the students and the college authority. With a view to this the college had a plan to implement the online admission procedure from the last year. But due to shortage of time and resources we failed to incorporate it that time. And we are lucky here that the State Government also thought in the same way and gave us grants for this purpose, so it implemented in this year, freely and flawlessly.
- **4. The Practice:** The grant from the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal gave us some extra oxygen. We consulted with a number of software developers about admission software, and the best one among them was chosen to develop software for our admission procedure. The Software was implemented in a way that it will collect online forms, will make the merit list by analysing the data supplied by the students, and will inform them when they have to pay their admission fees to the bank.

All the guidelines of the affiliating university were maintained for preparing the online merit list, and giving the students the room for choosing the alternative subject combinations available.

- **5. Evidence of success:** We can site these scenarios as the evidence of success of the project:
 - The long queues for collecting the admission form are vanished.
 - No single grievances about the admission process form any of the stakeholders of the institute or from any corner of the society.
 - We got students from a vast geographical region, and all of them are quality students.
- 6. Problems encountered and Resources Required: As it was the first time, nobody was habituated with this process. So there was some little lack of conception form the part of a little few the potential students. Some of them did not have internet access, too. Anyway, the institution did not let it to be a major problem. Everybody associated with the college lent their hands in help of anybody confused. A very special role was played by the existing students of the college in this regard, who helped their juniors in all the possible ways, both on and off the campus.

Best Practice No. 2

- 1. **Title of the Practice:** Construction of Water Hut.
- **2**. **Goal:** The goal of this practice is

- To provide a source of continuous flow of drinking water to the students.
- To ensure that the students are not suffering from the crisis of drinking water within the college campus.
- To encourage the students for not drinking water from random and unhygienic sources.
- To cope up with the water demand of gradually increasing student strength.

With a view to these aims, we have constructed three new classrooms in the second floor of the commerce building of the college. .

- **3**. **The context:** The College had a very large number of students over years, but there was no source of sufficient and purified water for them. There was only a deep tubewell as the source of water. So, in order to meet the very urgent requirement, we planned for a water hut. We communicated with the Krishnagar Lions Club for this purpose, and they were very willing to participate in this project. As a collaborated effort, the water hut is constructed which now serves all the students of the college.
- **4. The Practice:** The water hut provides a continuous flow of drinking water. It is a salvation form the crisis of drinking water within the college campus. The cost of the water hut is `1,00,000 of which 50% is contributed by the Lions Club, Krishnagar, and the rest is sanctioned by the Governing Body of the college. It is constructed in such a place that is almost at the centre of the college campus, and easily accessible for the students of all the departments.

But, we think that in the near future we need to think more about how to improve its capacity, so that the rush in the limited number of taps of hut could be decreased.

- **5. Evidence of success:** We can site these scenarios as the evidence of success of the project:
 - The old tubewell of the college campus is of very rare use now, for cleaning and watering the plants mainly, not for drinking.
 - During summer, a queue of students is seen at the hut, though the time at the queue is merely negligible.
 - As per the oral feedback from the students, they are highly satisfied with this water hut project.
- **6. Problems encountered and Resources Required:** The water hut does not have a shade yet, and it is in our plan to build a shade on it. We will take this initiative before the coming summer.
