INFRASTRUCURAL UPGRADATION

CONNECTING BRIDGE:

In an effort to enhance the infrastructure and connectivity of our college campus, a new connecting bridge has been constructed between the Main Building and Netaji Bhawan. The bridge serves as a convenient and efficient pathway for students, faculty, and staff, facilitating easy access between the two buildings. This addition represents a significant step forward in the college's commitment to providing a modern and functional environment for academic pursuits and social engagement. The connecting bridge was built with the primary aim of enhancing mobility and convenience within the campus. Prior to the bridge, moving between these two buildings required navigating outdoor pathways that were subject to weather conditions and sometimes increased travel time. With the new bridge, students can now move seamlessly between buildings, promoting a more integrated campus experience.



WALKING RAMP:

In alignment with the college's commitment to inclusivity and accessibility, a new ramp has been constructed on campus to facilitate access for physically challenged individuals. This initiative aims to ensure that all members of our community can navigate the campus safely and comfortably. The ramp has been designed specifically to accommodate the needs of those who rely on wheelchairs, walkers, or other mobility aids. Located at key entry points of major campus buildings, the ramp ensures that students, faculty, staff, and visitors with physical challenges can move freely and independently. This addition reflects the college's dedication to creating a supportive environment for all.



SMART CLASSROOMS:



As part of our commitment to providing a cutting-edge educational environment, new smart classrooms, 12 in number, have been established across the college campus. These classrooms are equipped with the latest technology to support innovative teaching methods, enhance student engagement, and facilitate interactive learning experiences. Each smart classroom is equipped with high-

definition 56 inches interactive screens, advanced audio-visual systems, desktop computer, modernized sitting desks, new green and white boards and internet-enabled devices. These tools enable faculty to integrate multimedia resources, virtual demonstrations, and real-time online collaboration into their lessons, making learning more dynamic and immersive.



NEW COMPUTER LAB:

A new computer lab has been established on the college campus, providing students and faculty with access to state-of-the-art technology for academic and research purposes. This facility supports our commitment to offering high-quality resources that enhance learning and foster digital literacy. Additionally, the lab features high-speed (more than 100 MBPS)

internet access, printing facilities, and specialized software to support a range of disciplines. Comfortable seating and a spacious layout ensure a conducive working environment both for students and teachers.

NEW CYCLE STAND FOR STAFF:

A new cycle shade has been constructed on the college campus, dedicated to providing secure and convenient parking for staff bicycles and motorbikes. The cycle shade is strategically located near the staff room for easy access and is spacious enough to accommodate multiple bicycles and motorbikes. Built with a durable and weather-resistant roof, the shade protects bicycles from sun, rain, and other environmental factors.



RENOVATION OF NETAJI BHAWAN:

The entire building of Netaji Bhawan (earlier known as DODL Building) along with our college campus, has recently undergone a comprehensive renovation, aimed at modernizing facilities and creating a more conducive environment for learning. The renovation project included updates to classrooms, important offices, common areas, and essential utilities.

NEW SEMINAR ROOMS (ROOM NO. 8 & 9):



As part of our ongoing efforts to enhance academic facilities and provide an optimal learning environment, two huge seminar rooms have been designed by renovating the room number 8 and 9 on the college campus. These rooms are designed to support collaborative learning, discussions, and presentations, catering to the growing academic needs of students and faculty. MARBLE STAIRS:

As part of ongoing efforts to improve the college's infrastructure and provide a safer, more aesthetically pleasing environment, the stairs across the campus have been renovated with high-quality marble flooring. This renovation enhances both the functionality and appearance of the building's stairways. The new marble flooring is also easy to maintain, adding long-term value to the college's infrastructure. Moreover, the upgraded stairs offer a more refined and modern look, aligning with the college's vision of creating a progressive and well-maintained campus.



T.V. IN TEACHERS' ROOM:

A new 65 inches television has been installed in the teachers' room on the college campus. The newly installed television is a high-definition model, strategically placed in a comfortable area within the teachers' room to ensure visibility from various seating areas. The television is connected to cable or streaming

VEGETABLE GARDEN:

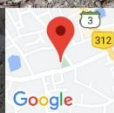

In an effort to improve campus infrastructure and ensure better management of water flow, a new water drainage system has been constructed on the college campus. This project is designed to prevent waterlogging, reduce flooding risks, and enhance the overall cleanliness and sustainability of the campus. The new drainage system consists of a series of underground pipes, drains, and catchment areas strategically placed around the campus to direct rainwater away from pathways, buildings, and other key areas. The system is designed to handle heavy rainfall, reducing water accumulation and ensuring that stormwater is effectively channelled into designated areas.



EXTENSION OF INDOOR GARDEN:

To enhance the aesthetic appeal and create a serene environment for students, faculty, and staff, the college has extended its indoor flower garden. This initiative aims to provide a peaceful and visually pleasing space that

STUDENTS SUPPORT

NEW PHASE OF LIBRARY BOOK PURCHASE:

To provide students and faculty with up-to-date learning materials, the college has initiated a new phase of library book purchases. This initiative is aimed at expanding the library's collection, ensuring it aligns with current academic needs, and supporting the diverse disciplines taught at the college. The new phase of book purchases focuses on acquiring a wide range of academic texts, including the latest editions of textbooks, reference books, journals, and other scholarly resources. This phase of book purchase aimed at collecting materials both for the upcoming Research Library and the Departmental Libraries. A total of 1,450 books were purchased at a cost of ₹500,964.

NEW SITTING DESKS FOR STUDENTS:

To improve the classroom environment and enhance the learning experience for students, the college has installed new desks in all classrooms. The new desks are designed to be more ergonomic that ensure comfort during long hours of study. The desks are equipped with ample workspace for books and personal items, allowing students to stay organized and focused. TELEVISION SCREENS IN PG CLASSROOMS:

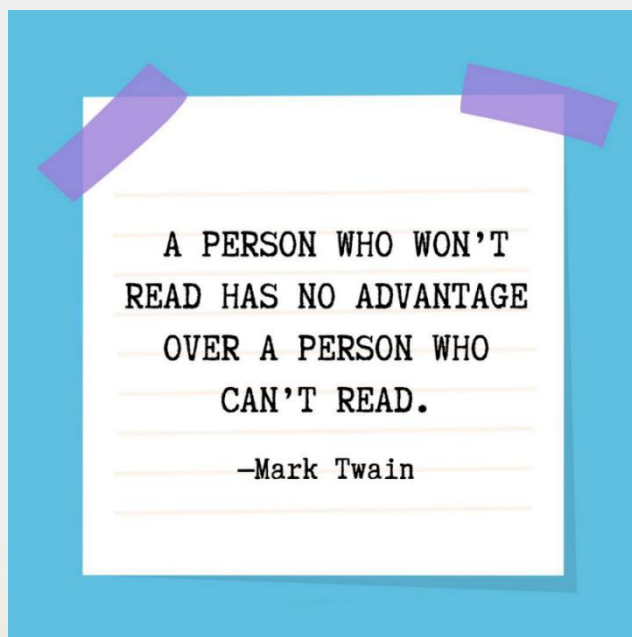

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

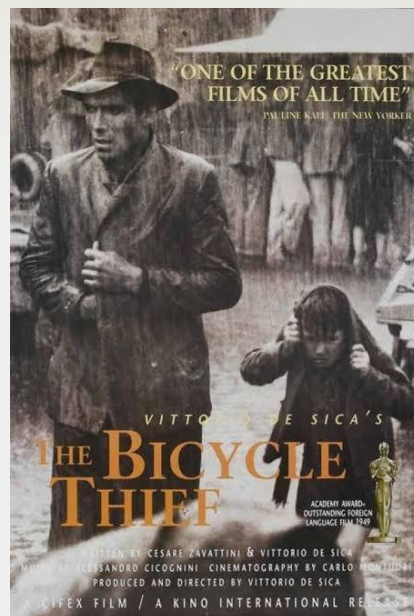

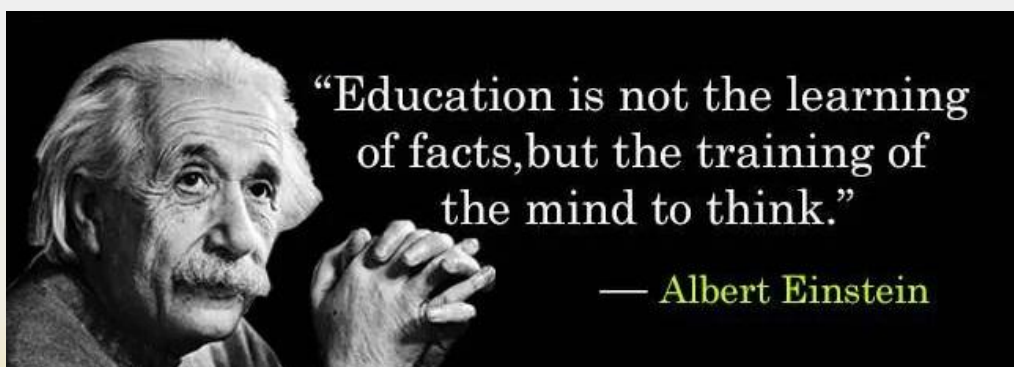

14/06/2024: INTERNAL

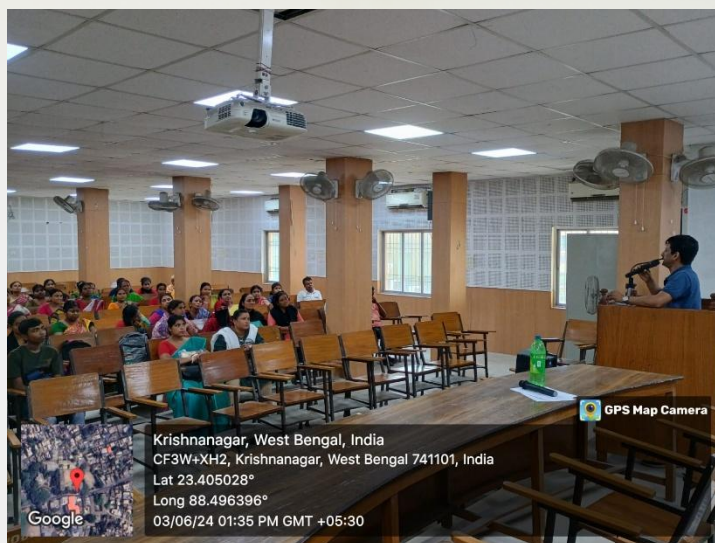

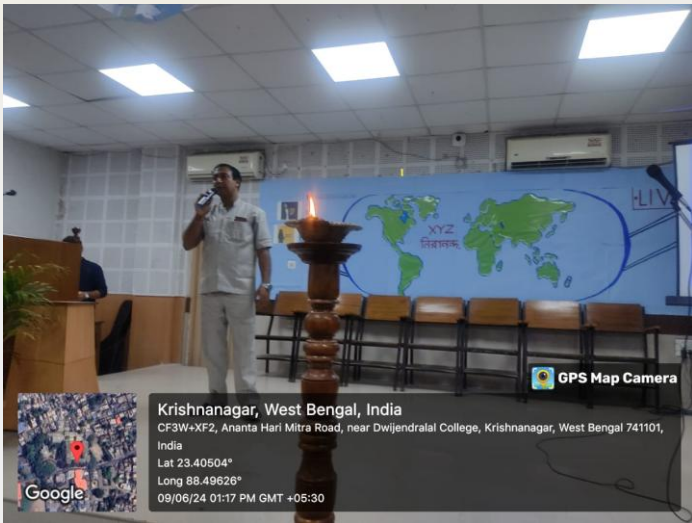

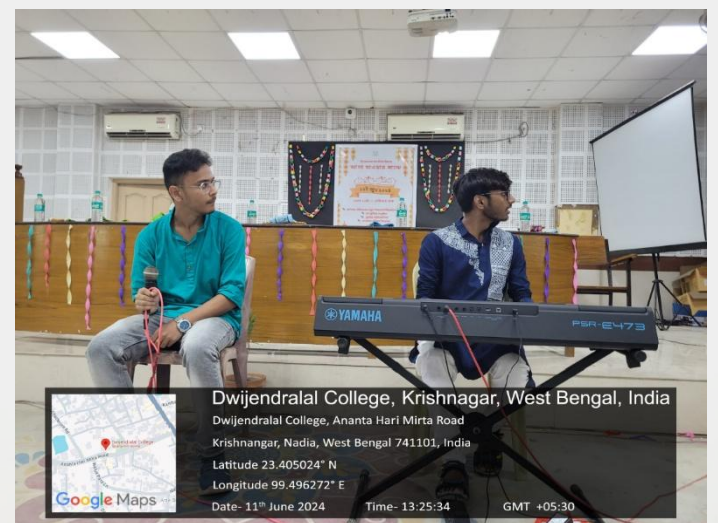
